5. Acceptance of February 4, 2017 Minutes

Ken Wigmore (Red Deer/Lacombe RCCWA) made the motion to accept the 2017 AGM Minutes as distributed. Bonny Swart (Sturgeon RCWA) 2nd. All in favor. Carried

- President & Secretary signed the minutes & copy of amended 2017 AGM minutes will be sent out to all associations when the draft copy of 2018 AGM minutes is distributed.

6. Business Arising from Minutes

A. Strategic Plan:

- Trevor reported that it is 90% complete & would be going through a revamping due to almost being completed & new goals needed to be added.

B. Awards - Trevor

- The RCMP Volunteer Awards was what was handed out this morning. The names had to be emailed into the RCMP K-Division Liaison in June 2017. The deadline to get certificates done up for association volunteers with 5, 10, 15, 20, 25 etc. years needs to be sent to Sgt. Martin Girard via the APRCWA email by August 1, 2018.
- Reminder that APRCWA does the Long Service/Active Member Award in recognition of their contribution to RCW and have retired or passed away. This year APRCWA recognized Des Grant from SE AB RCW for his years of contribution to the APRCWA Board & his local association.

7. Financial Report:

A. Report from 2017 Reviewers

- Peter Trommelen spoke on behalf of Gail Kaiser – Verna was commended on her excellent financials, Verna has done the books truly in detail & accurately per their review of the books.
- Verna thanked Peter & Gail for volunteering to review the books.

B. 2017 Financial Report – complete report attached to main minutes

- Income - from 3 major sources: Casino, Solicitor General, Operating (Membership, Sales of Signs & Supplies).
- Largest Dollar Expenses – Purchasing of signs & supplies, Wise Owl Program, Resource Material (Brochures), Promotion (Website Upgrade, Calendar Project), Insurance Expenses, Community Outreach (AGM & Presentations throughout the province), Director Expenses.
- Major concern to the board is if our funding would be reduced from the Solicitor General & Casino where we would get money from to operate so we do have a plan in place as far as a reserve.

Budget 2018 Review – complete report attached to main minutes

- Spending is broken up into 3 categories – Casino, Solicitor General & Operating
- Only certain expenditures can come out of the Casino funding & Solicitor General funding. Everything else comes out of the General Operating funding.
- Biggest portion for Operating Revenue comes from membership dues & sales of signs & supplies.
- Small portion of Operating Revenue comes from donations etc.

Verna moved to have the Financial Report adopted as presented. Peter Trommelen (Hillside RCW) 2nd. All in favor. Carried.

C. Appointment of 2018 Reviewers

- Verna called for the appointment of reviewers for the books of accounts.
- Peter Trommelen & Gail Kaiser volunteered to do the review of the 2018 books of accounts. All in favor. Carried.

D. Other – Nothing brought forward

8. Honorary Members Reports

A. RCMP – Sgt. Martin Girard

- Video of the Signing of the MOU was shown. MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) was last signed in 2013.
- Martin thanked the volunteers for helping to tackle crime in rural Alberta.
- The RCMP is looking to promote RCW by appointing a Liaison Officer in each detachment to work with the local RCW boards.

B. Fish & Wildlife – Inspector Richard Lyons

- Help is needed to ensure that crimes get reported & charges are laid by being the “Eye & Ears” of your communities to report poaching
- Reporting via text is now being accepted
- Encourage your membership to make the call to the RAP Line or local offices to assist the officers in the field with catching people breaking the law
- A 9 Slide presentation was shown which showed:
 - ➔ Background – 55 Enforcement Districts & 130 “Field” Officers
 - ➔ Reporting Violations can be done thru Report A Poacher @ 1-800-642-3800 or #3800 on the Telus Mobility Network, Online thru the Report A Poacher Website
 - ➔ Last Year the RAP program paid \$108,600.00 in rewards to individuals who calls & information led to charges.

- Richard's exact words **“We need RCW members to help us by reporting suspicious activity, poachers, fishing violations, etc. thru the reporting means to help stop these crimes & assist officers in getting the violations into the courts.**
- Full PowerPoint presentation is attached to the main minutes

C. Farmers Advocate

- Trevor introduced Jeana Schuurman with the Farmers Advocate Office to announce the winner of the 2017 Grant for the Most Active RCW in the amount of \$1000.00 & trophy.
- Jeana reported that they had a strong response to the solicitation for entries & were pleased to see 11 different applications come in; it was awesome to read about the work that is being done in the communities to help keep rural Alberta safe.
 - ➔ Cochrane Foothills Protection Association for the work they did with the development of its Reporter App. This is an application that people can use on the computers or smart phones to track crime on a satellite map. They will be receiving \$500.00 for this initiative.
 - ➔ Kitscoty & District RCW will be receiving the other \$500.00 for the purchase of Phone Tree which is an automatic calling system that will help streamline their approach to staying in touch with their members.
- For groups applying in the future a few tips:
 - ◆ The money has to be designated towards a special project.
 - ◆ Ideally the project must be completed within the year the application is submitted or at least in a definitive stage of implementation has been reached.
 - ◆ The project should be something that's above & beyond what is normally done or or expected from a RCWA
- Jeana called both associations up to have photos taken
- Reminder that the deadline for the 2018 Grant is December 31, 2018

D. Solicitor General's Department – Carsten Erbe

- Been a busy year for crime prevention
- APRCWA is recognized for the work they do to promote crime prevention across Alberta
- Community Safety is our #1 priority
- Civil Forfeiture Grant are being handed out again so submit your applications
- We understand that support is required for the crime prevention programs
- Cannot stress enough the importance of “people reporting to the RCMP” as opposed to just thru social media – numbers do not get recorded thru social media
- Crime Prevention Award – 2018 deadline for the award is February 20, 2018
- Alberta Community Crime Prevention Association – March is Fraud Prevention Month – their conference is in Edmonton this year May 8-10/18
- Follow our Twitter & Facebook pages for Funding information
- Alberta Crime Prevention Week runs May 14 – 21, 2018
- It's a pleasure to see such a great rural crowd in attendance for this conference today

Judy Schlichenmayer (Olds RCW) moved that the Honorary Members Reports be accepted as presented. Penny Tychkowsky (Smoky Lake County RCWA) 2nd. All in favor. Carried.

9. President's Report – Trevor Tychkowsky - full report attached to main minutes

- Thank you everyone for a great turnout & Red Deer/Lacombe for hosting this great event
- Accomplishments that we have seen this year include:
 - ◆ MOU was signed yesterday (February 15, 2018) & copies were included in the voter packages you received – this signing solidifies the commitment of APRCWA & the RCMP. We will still be the eyes & ears within our communities & we need to educate your members to report suspicious activities. The commitment of the RCMP to provide a liaison officer that will share information to the member when possible & how we can help will assist the associations greatly. Subject matter experts being made available to be a speaker pertaining to crime prevention helps us get your membership educated. The

- MOU also has defined Security Clearances from suitability checks for all your members & a full security check every 3 years for all directors & executive members with the local groups.
- ◆ Better means of Communication was accomplished by redoing our website – we have seen the great work Dean as done & will hear more about this in his report
 - ◆ We will be working on expanding notice of information with social media to include a Facebook Page.
 - ◆ Rosemary has been putting out the newsletter to communicate with the membership as well
 - ◆ We looked into updating to a new fanout system & Cor did the research - we now have the ability to do a fanout in matter of minutes instead of hours with the old system
 - ◆ The directors reached out to any group that was struggling & needed help – our job was to assist you when called upon, speaking to new RCW groups or prospective RCW as there has been more of this in the past year than ever before. The 2 new groups are in attendance today as was as there are 6 other groups working on getting started up
 - ◆ Ensuring that we educate our membership at a local level how to protect their belongings and the importance of locking up belongings, marking their belongings in the event it is stolen so it can be properly identified in the event of recovery.
 - ◆ APRCWA has done more interviews throughout the province than ever before – this media attention has been because of the call for concern of rising crime rates. On Tuesday (February 20th) I will be doing a live interview on CTV AB Primetime just as an example of the interview requests we have had.
 - ◆ Our next accomplishment was tabled for a while but is now moving forward – the new RCW video filming has started and we expect to have it completed by the fall time. We have a 1 minute trailer to be shown as a preview to what to expect. We are also working on a 5-7min promotional video that will be used to promote RCW. Once that is completed we will be looking to do short “how to” videos – if there are any ideas for videos we would like to hear about them.
 - ◆ The board worked a casino @ WEM – thank you to everyone who helped out with this. Brenda will be giving a detailed report on this event.
 - ◆ Our project to find a place to call home since losing our office space the the O’Donoghue Building and having the ability to be able to contact someone when you called as well as improve the way we do business for APRCWA has finally arrived & we are extremely excited to have signed a contract with Central Alberta Crime Prevention Centre in Red Deer which has several full time staff that will answering our phones and forwarding our emails. They will be able to help us with lots of the administration duties & have subject matter experts that could speak to the local APRCWA associations throughout the province.
 - ◆ Expect to see changes as the year moves on & you will hear more later in the meeting.
- Finally this will be my president’s report as I will be stepping down & letting another board member have a new prospective at it. I will be assuming the role as past president & will be helping when I can. This was not an easy decision but felt this was the best way to avoid burnout & then having to leave the organization completely. I have been seeing local RCW that were very active, lose members & fold – we the provincial board will not let that happen to to us as we have amazing directors that are so committed to this board & proud to say that I am part of if it.
 - Thank you to everyone for what you do in your community – let’s keep going as we can make a difference in lowering the crime rated.

Bernie Tchir (Smoky Lake County RCWA) moved that the President’s Report be accepted as presented. Bonny Swart (Sturgeon RCWA) 2nd. All in favor. Carried.

10. Committee Reports:

A. Sign & Supplies – Lee Kasper

- 42 orders for 2017 – 4 since Jan 2018

- Orders are being placed online through the website – login is required
- We get notified of the order & once payment is received the order is shipped or ready for pickup in person or a director
- There is a standard \$50.00 shipping charge on all orders being shipped
- No increase to sign cost per supplier
- Stock is kept low to prevent overages – allow lots of time for your order to be filled.
- The 48” x 48” signs are no longer being kept in stock – custom order so please allow at least 6 weeks for this item
- The waxy paper between the signs helps preserve the writing on the signs so **do not** remove until the signage is being put up as the supplier will not replace signs that are not stored properly.

B. Promotional Products – Tom Finch/Patty Franchuk/Cor DeWit

- Items are available through the website to be purchased – display at the front of the stage of all the items available
- Inventory is:
 - ◆ Fly Swatters – 420
 - ◆ Frisbee – 271
 - ◆ Lanyard – 124

 - ◆ Pens – 287
 - ◆ Water Bottles – 213
 - ◆ Tape Measures – 268
- The membership has requested clothing be made available for purchasing so Patty showed 2 styles of tee-shirts (long & short sleeved) done up with APRCWA logo on the left chest area for the membership to consider. The option to get RURAL CRIME WATCH on the back & the RCW location on the right sleeve. Patty’s shirts had her position on the long sleeve shirt which the cost would be \$40.00 & the RCW she belongs to on short sleeved one which would cost \$35.00. if the membership is interested the BOD will be moving forward to input an online ordering process & standard shipping charge in place. Red Deer/Lacombe showed an interest so hopefully after our next BOD meeting we will be announcing that orders could be placed.
- Cor showed a sample of a windbreaker jacket which was an option as well for the membership. The color would be neon yellow & black with the logo on the left chest & Rural Crime Watch on the back. Coat would be \$70.00 per jacket.

C. Membership Update – Verna Hart – complete report attached to main minutes

- Currently have 55 members throughout the province
- There are 16,358 volunteers belong to our member associations
- Please fill out the **number of members** in your association as that help us with **stats** for the **RCMP & Solicitor General**
- Currently working with 15 groups across the province – both new & struggling associations to get them going or to stay operational
- As the APRCWA has to ensure our members carry liability insurance & to do so all members have to be compliant.
- To be compliant the following must be completed:
 - ◆ The APRCWA Membership Renewal Form along with \$200.00 for membership dues – gives you the benefit of the liability insurance
 - ◆ A copy of your current or latest Proof of Filing – although Service Canada was running behind please ensure you get your POF to us ASAP -
 - ◆ The completed signed insurance form that is in your renewal package
- If you have not included all the above listed documentation, you are considered a non-member therefore do not have liability insurance.
- Continue to struggle to get you as member to comply

- **Payment** date for **Renewal** of your **Membership** will be due **August 1st, 2018**
- **If we do not have your Membership Dues, Proof of Filing & completed Insurance Form by August 1st, 2018 – liability insurance will be cancelled as of October 31st – Once the liability insurance is cancelled it will not be re-instated** therefore you have to **wait 1 full year** before you **get liability insurance & become a member of APRCWA again.**
- **Reminder** – If you cease to carry on as a member of the APRCWA **all signage** must be **taken down & returned** to APRCWA, the **RCMP Detachments of non-members** will be **advised** the association is no longer an APRCWA member as **per** a request from **RCMP “K” Division.**
- Please keep APRCWA up to date on changes in your associations – advising these changes ensures we have accurate information to forward information to you – having an email account for your association simplifies everything as we can then get you information quickly and if your executive changes the email stays the same ensuring you get all the information sent out

D. Poster Contest/Calendar Project – Patty Franchuk – list attached to main minutes

- Thank you to the 11 associations that participated in the 2018 Poster Contest & to the Solicitor General for providing the plaques to the 1st place winners of the 38th Annual Poster Contest
- There was 1 home schooled entry this year
- Only 1 computer entry so the category has been removed & entries will be all judged under the 1 category for each grade
- Reminder that the contest entries have to be in to the APRCWA by November 6, 2018.
- Open to all school kids but contest does not have to be run thru the schools
- Please ensure you do the judging at the local RCW level & then only submit the 1st place winners to the APRCWA for judging.
- Contest can be done anytime between February 2018 & October 2018
- Forms are in your registration packages & on the APRCWA website under Poster Contest
- Thank you to Inspector Richard Lyons for allowing the calendars to be shipped through the courier to the associations.
- If you are interested in receive a box of calendars please email Patty thru the APRCWA email as calendars are only sent to requesting RCW this year as only 5000 calendars are being printed to be distributed to the RCWs, RCMP, Solicitor General & Fish & Wildlife.
- The 2018-19 Calendars will be ready for distribution in August – Calendar will start September 2018 thru to August 2019
- Distribution will be done again thru the local Fish & Wildlife offices primarily – if you do not have a F&W office then it would be thru the zone directors

E. Wise Owls Program – Marvin Annell

- 51 presentation have been completed up to November 1st, 2017
- Presenters available across the province
- Mascot is available to be booked for events – forms are on the website in the association login
- To request a presentation please complete the forms on the website under the Wise Owl tab in the association area

F. Insurance – Tom Finch (Verna gave report) full report attached to minutes

- When membership of \$200.00 is paid & are a compliant association – benefit of liability insurance
- The insurance form consists of 2 parts:
 - ◆ Liability Insurance portion needs to be checked off – benefit of the membership
 - ◆ Option to purchase additional Volunteer Insurance (VFIS) for additional premiums of :

- ❖ Up to Age 70 – \$200.00
- ❖ Up to Aug 80 - \$250.00
- ❖ No over 80 coverage
- ❖ Property Insurance is available to add to your policy – ie: cargo trailer insurance.
- ♦ Example: If wishing to purchase VFIS up to Age 70 APRCWA needs to receive \$400.00 (\$200.00 for membership & \$200.00 for VFIS Insurance). If wishing to purchase up to Age 80 VFIS – APRCWA needs to receive \$450.00 (\$200.00 membership & \$250.00 for VFIS insurance).
- ♦ Insurance Form must be completed & signed, returned to APRCWA along with a copy of your Proof of Filing to prove that your association is a non-profit organization in good standing with Corporate Registries. APRCWA will forward this information off to the insurer when received.
- ♦ **Reminder:** If your insurance is cancelled due to non-compliance – You must wait until the next renewal year to get liability insurance & therefore become a member.
- We have included in your voter packages information on the incident procedures when needing to file a claim.
- The insurance does not cover you as a BOD but does cover you as a general volunteer
- To have your questions about your insurance coverage answered you can contact John @ Jubilee Insurance 780-955-3639 as each situation is different & it is difficult to explain as a general incident.

G. Website – Dean Hart

- Dean did a presentation on how to navigate through the website, logging into the association area & the differences between the being logged in & just viewing the website in general
 - ➔ Contacting the association is now easier due to the link for emailing
 - ➔ Associations are listed & if consent was given their contact email is listed as well otherwise it is sent to the APRCWA email to be sent to the association
 - ➔ Wise Owl information
 - ➔ RCMP Detachment area can be assessed & the contact information for the detachment is linked as well
 - ➔ Members Area – need approval to login – tabs within the site for the membership area & access to the Sign & Supplies tab

- This event is a major fundraiser for APRCWA as it helps with our Wise Owl program, poster contest & other expenses
- The date of the casino was January 11 & 12, 2018 held at the Starlight Casino (formally the Palace Casino)
- Our revenue will not be received until after the 1st quarter is completed which will be March 31, 2018
- I would like to thank the volunteers who came out to work the casino – APRCWA board members, local association members from Sturgeon, Strathcona, Leduc, Grande Prairie, Rosebrier, Golden Spike & Hillside, our Fish & Wildlife liaison, family of a member of Strathcona RCWA (not RCW members) – Thank you to everyone who came out for this event as without you this fundraiser would never have been possible for APRCWA
- We did come up short in our volunteer requirements & had to have a Casino Angel come in to help us out of the bind.
- We are granted a casino every 2 years so the 1st quarter of 2020 will be our next one tentatively – I will have my pen & Paper ready at this time next year to record names for the casino recruitment sign-up & hope for it to be a long list of volunteers to choose from

- Doing “Active” patrols is looking for crimes in the area
- An information sheet was included in the voter package envelopes

- Information is also posted on the website
- Out MOU supports “Passive Patrols”
- “Active Patrols” are covered in the COP (Citizens on Patrol) MOU information

D. Signage Not Approved by APRCWA – Trevor Tychkowsky

- Only APRCWA “Approved” Signage should be displayed in a APRCWA member area
- There are certain specifications that need to be met & purchasing the signage through APRCWA ensures that
- If you know of a company that can give APRCWA a better price than what we are receiving please forward the information & we will research it
- If signage is displayed that is not APRCWA approved – APRCWA has the right to cancel the non-compliant associations’ membership and all APRCWA property must be returned to APRCWA immediately.

E. CACPA (Central Alberta Crime Prevention Association)– Trevor Tychkowsky

- Introduced Terry Lynn with CACPA
- 5 Partners are Crimestoppers, Neighborhood Watch, MADD, COP & now APRCWA
- Verna will be tour representation on the CACPA Board
- This gives us a home with a desk, office space, phone answering, storage area, emailing

F. Fan-Out System – Cor DeWit

- Cost is \$2.40USD per member per year
- Fast & Efficient – Leduc & Valleyview are using the system already

G. Speakers (CEPTED & Fentanyl) – Trevor Tychkowsky

- CEPTED courses are available for rural areas
 - ◆ Basic 2 day course
 - ◆ Advanced is a 3 day course
 - ◆ CACPA – has more information on the programs or contact APRCWA for information
- Fentanyl Presentations – RCMP Speaker
 - ◆ Available to presentation across the province
 - ◆ APRCWA looking to put it as one of the education programs available to the 55 members
 - ◆ Partnership with the RCMP as well

H. ACCPA (Alberta Community Crime Prevention Association – Trevor Tychkowsky
